Discussion Questions

- **1.** Discuss the varying ways agape is used in John 3 and Luke 11. How are these uses different from the common understanding of agape presented in the previous videos?
- 2. What emotions did you see agape connected to and contrasted with?
- **3.** How does God want us to love Him?
- **4.** How did Jesus perceive God's love?
- 5. How did God give His love to Jesus?

Spiritual Exercise

- **1.** Take time to ask God to reveal His love to you.
- 2. Please read Zephaniah 3:17:

The LORD your God is in your midst, a victorious warrior. He will exult over you with joy, He will be quiet in His love, He will rejoice over you with shouts of joy.

Paraphrase this verse and then describe in your own words what God's love looks like here. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you experience God rejoicing over you. Can you remember a time when you were distraught and experienced God's love quieting your heart, your emotions?

- **3.** Ask the Holy Spirit if there is a verse describing agape that He wants you to experience in a greater way. If so, write the verse out, and pray through it..
- **4.** What did you struggle with the most in this video? Consider taking further time to study the Scriptures about this topic, and commit it to prayer.

Continuing to look at Agape as an Emotion

- F. Agape as Love Which is Common to Humanity (Luke 6:32; 7:5; Matt. 5:46):

Discussion Questions

- 1. What is the most important truth you learned in this lesson? Discuss.
- **2.** Read the following verse about *agape* for the wrong things (Luke 11:43):

Woe to you Pharisees! For you love the chief seats in the synagogues and the respectful greetings in the market places.

What does the ability to *agape* the wrong things tell you about the nature of *agape*?

3. *Agape* in Scripture describes various aspects of human love. Consider your feelings for someone you really love. What aspects of love do you find within your own heart?

This exercise can give you an indication of the way God feels towards you. Take what you've written about your love for others and deliberately apply it to God's heart towards you. Write down one aspect of your love for others which stretches your faith about God's love for you. Why is it a struggle to believe?

4. What did you struggle with the most in this video? Consider taking further time to study the Scriptures about this topic, and commit it to prayer.

5. What have people agaped and why?

Spiritual Exercises

- **1.** As we learned in the video, *agape* can be for the wrong reasons. Let's take a few minutes to ask the Holy Spirit if this is an issue in our own lives.
- 2. Please paraphrase, personalize and pray through Isaiah 30:18:

Yet the LORD longs to be gracious to you; He rises to show you compassion. For the LORD is a God of justice. Blessed are all who wait for Him!

3. Prayer of Renunciation: Break off any bondage from false understandings of agape and declare the truth of God's love.
